War Horse (2011) PG-13: UUUUUU

As expected, Steven Spielberg serves us a visual splendor in this heart warming story about a boy, a horse, and the adventures they endure together and on their own. The movie starts out during the early 20th century in the serene lush countryside of England where Albert (the boy) and Joey (the horse) form a trusting friendship. Albert and Joey get separated because of hardships on the family farm. Soon thereafter, we venture into France during WW1 where Albert and Joey embark on journeys apart from each other, with the hope of someday finding each other again. This film is shot the old fashioned way (on actual film stock) which reminds the viewer that Mr. Spielberg wants you to take a step back in time and enjoy this epic film for what it is; a story with extraordinary cinematography and no frills. You might find yourself laughing, crying, and even pointing out some Hollywood misconceptions on horses. This is a good movie, paying homage to the forgotten heroes of the war: The Horse
